## REGULAR MEETING

#### Council Chamber:

Mayor Stevenson presided at the Regular Meeting of Council held on the above date and place.

Mayor Stevenson called the meeting to order.

Borough Clerk VanScoy read the opening statement regarding the Open Public Meetings Act.

Rev. Melvin Orr conducted the Invocation.

Mayor Stevenson asked all those present to join in the salute to the flag, which was conducted by Borough Clerk VanScoy.

Members present were: Council President Giovannitti, Councilman DiTonno, Councilman Giampola, Councilman Haynes, Councilman Holloway, Councilman Kidd.

Presentation of awards for Paulsboro Clean Community.

Administrator Jacobucci stated the Borough is presenting checks to Paulsboro Little League and Paulsboro Pet Food Bank for their contribution to cleaning up the town.

No one was present to receive the checks from Paulsboro Little League and Paulsboro Pet Food Bank.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR. (Regular Meeting – Agenda item questions only.)

Mayor Stevenson opened the floor to the public and asked anyone speaking to give their name, address and reminded everyone there was a five (5) minute time limit.

Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman DiTonno seconded to open the floor to the public. All were in favor of the motion.

There wasn't any public participation at this time.

Councilman DiTonno moved and Council President Giovannitti seconded to close the floor to the public. All were in favor of the motion.

Summary of reports and copies of minutes of meetings.

Council President Giovannitti moved and Councilman Giampola seconded to receive, file and adopt the minutes and the reports. All were in favor of the motion.

#### **COMMUNICATION – CORRESPONDENCE:**

#### MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Public Safety Committee: Councilman DiTonno, Chairman:

Councilman DiTonno stated the Paulsboro Little League will be holding their Annual Opening Day Parade on Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup>, 2019. He also stated the Loudenslager School is holding a Career Day on April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

Community Betterment Committee: Councilman Kidd, Chairman:

Councilman Kidd did not have anything to report at this time.

Public Property Committee: Councilman Holloway, II, Chairman:

Councilman Holloway did not have anything to report at this time but he wished everyone a Happy Spring and Happy Easter.

Public Works Committee: Councilman Haynes, Chairman:

Councilman Haynes reported that Thomson Avenue is moving along. He also reported the Borough received a grant from NJDOT for \$270,000 for the Washington Street Project from Delaware Street to Pine Street and the contractor will be starting work on the CDBG road project.

Councilman Haynes further reported NJDOT will be milling and paving Broad Street from Billingsport Road to the West Deptford Wawa. There will not be any parking on Broad Street and there will be alternating traffic patterns.

Borough Engineer Biermann stated signage will be placed to inform everyone.

Finance Committee: Councilman Giampola, Chairman:

Councilman Giampola stated Council will be adopting a temporary budget that will cover the next two (2) months. The State's "FAST" system isn't so fast. He wished everyone Happy Spring and stated the Borough will be holding their annual Spring Clean-Up on Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. with a rain date of Sunday, April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

Mayor Stevenson stated the Port is done pounding poles due to the "spawning" season. And he complimented the wall that the Port built as it looks nice. He thanked the Port.

Councilman Haynes questioned if there was anything that could be done about the train whistle blowing.

Mayor Stevenson stated the whistle blows due to Federal regulations and it blows at all approaching intersections regardless of what time. He brought this up with the Railroad Industry and they have to follow the Federal rules.

Councilman Haynes stated the train blows the horn before the Port to get the gate open.

Mayor Stevenson stated this should be done by radio and not by horn. He will follow up and make a phone call regarding this. The Port is getting ready to work on the "wye" railroad track which is to be used by the Port trains.

Councilman Kidd stated the train whistle blowing is worse in the center of town.

Mayor Stevenson stated they have to blow the whistle 200 or 300 feet before the intersection.

Chief Kille stated they have to blow the whistle at all intersections.

Mayor Stevenson stated he will make a phone call.
