Mayor Stevenson presided at the Regular Teleconference Meeting of Council, held on the above date, place and by going to Zoom at <https://zoom.us>, enter Meeting ID: 860 3874 0610 and the passcode: 751776 to enter the meeting or at the following link:

Join Zoom Meeting:

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Due to the public health emergency caused by the Coronavirus (COVID-19), and the subsequent issuance of the Governor's Executive Order 107, the Borough of Paulsboro, effective April 7, 2020, and until further notice, will conduct all future meetings remotely and by electronic means without providing a physical meeting place. The Borough Hall will not be open to the public for this meeting. The electronic public meeting is being held in lieu of an in-person public meeting due to the state of emergency arising from the

current situation involving the COVID-19 virus and to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the public.

Mayor Stevenson called the Regular Teleconference Meeting to order.

Mayor Stevenson read the opening statement regarding the Open Public Meetings Act. Pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.A.C. 5:39-1.1-1.7 and P.L. 2020, C. 34, adequate notice of this Regular Teleconference Meeting, as required by said Act, has been provided by contacting each Council Member, posting the scheduled meeting on the Municipal Bulletin Board and doors, and on the Borough's website, emailed and faxed to the South Jersey Times and the Courier Post and filed with the Borough Clerk on January 5, 2021.

Members present were: Council President Giovannitti, Councilman DiTonno, Councilman Giampola, Councilman Haynes, Councilman Holloway, Councilman Kidd.

PROCLAMATIONS: Romeo Dixon of Romeo Records

Mayor Stevenson asked Councilman Holloway to read the proclamation into the record.

Councilman Holloway read the proclamation into the record and he will present the proclamation to Mr. Dixon at the annual Juneteenth Celebration event on Saturday, June 19th.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Teleconference Regular Meeting, May 4, 2021, at 6:00 p.m.

Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman DiTonno seconded to adopt the above minutes. All were in favor of the motion.

Summary of reports and copies of minutes of various meetings.

Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman DiTonno seconded to receive, file and approve the above reports and minutes. All were in favor of the motion.

COMMUNICATION – CORRESPONDENCE:

Letter from Tax Collector Georjean Widener regarding uncollectable taxes. Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman DiTonno seconded to receive and file the letter. All were in favor of the motion.

Letter from Regina Sesay, Tenia Taborn and Ashley Williams of Paintball Forever requesting use of Fort Billings Park.

Mayor and Council discussed this type of use for the park.

Councilman Holloway, Property Committee, stated he would like to speak with the individuals regarding their use of the park for a paintball event, the safety aspects, the clean-up, etc.

Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman DiTonno seconded to receive, table, turn the request over to the Committee. All were in favor of the motion.

Letter from Ayanna Bundy requesting use of Borough property on June 5th from 2:00 to 9:00 p.m.

Mayor and Council discussed the use of this property for a bounce house for the children at the event.

Administrator Jacobucci stated the Borough's Insurance Company will not insure bounce houses because of the liability and the high premiums involved.

Mayor Stevenson stated the Borough's insurance does not allow for bounce houses and he doesn't think it is safe for the children to be running across the street to the bounce house.

Councilman Holloway questioned if there was a process to approve anyone using Borough property.

Mayor Stevenson stated there is only an application process for the use of Fort Billings Park and the Borough would have to draw up a new policy for the use of other Borough property.

Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman DiTonno seconded to receive, file the letter and deny the request. All were in favor of the motion.

Letter from Paulsboro Midget Football Organization requesting use of the Soccer Field on Billingsport Road.

Mayor and Council discussed the use of this property for a cornhole tournament fundraising event for the Paulsboro Midget Football Organization.

It was felt this request be turned over to Councilman Kidd of the Community Betterment Committee and Councilman Holloway of the Public Property Committee but it would be approved pending their review and research.

Council President Giovannitti moved and Councilman Haynes seconded to receive, file the request, approve the request pending the Committees review and research. All were in favor of the motion except Councilman DiTonno abstained.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Finance Committee: Councilman Giampola, Chairman:

Councilman Giampola stated the Budget is on the agenda for approval.

Councilman Giampola questioned when the Borough Hall will be re-opening to the public.

Administrator Jacobucci recommended a soft opening commencing July 6th on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday with a full opening after Labor Day in September.

Councilman Giampola stated the rest of the State is opening everything at this time. He felt the Borough Hall should open effective June 6th at normal business hours.

Councilman Kidd questioned what about residents coming into the Borough Hall without their vaccination.

Councilman Giampola stated the Borough can require they wear a mask.

Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman Haynes seconded to authorize the opening of Borough Hall effective June 7th at normal business hours and require the wearing of face masks for the public and the employees. All were in favor of the motion.

Councilman Giampola questioned when the Mayor and Council would commence with in person meetings. He wanted to start in July.

Mayor Stevenson stated in person meetings will commence in September as they are not out of the woods yet with the pandemic. The Court Room would be packed and he doesn't feel comfortable. He felt Council should wait until after summer.

Councilman Giampola stated there are how many members of Council at Borough Hall for this meeting. He felt having in person meetings start in July.

Councilman Kidd felt the Borough should not start opening everything as COVID is no joke. He also felt to wait to have in person meetings until September.

Councilman Giampola stated the Borough is not accomplishing everything and there are four (4) Councilmembers at Borough Hall now.

Councilman Kidd stated those Councilmembers have had their vaccinations.

Councilman Giampola stated he looked forward to Summer.

Councilman Giampola stated the Borough has received a USDA grant in the amount of \$840,000 to proceed with West Washington Street project.

Public Works Committee: Councilman Haynes, Chairman:

Councilman Haynes reported on the West Washington Street Project. It will go out to bid in August and start construction in mid-October. The Borough received two (2) grants. The Borough received \$520,000 from NJDOT and \$840,000 from USDA. The Borough also received a USDA loan in the amount of \$970,000. This funding will be used to upgrade the water mains, drainage and paving.

Councilman Haynes also reported on the Port Water Main Project. The project has been completed and the roads have been paved. The Engineers will be drawing up a punch list of items that will need to be addressed.

Councilman Haynes further reported the Borough is applying for 2022 NJDOT funding to add onto the existing project on Delaware Street from the Railroad tracks to Taylor Road and from Taylor Road to Billingsport Road and needs the Council's approval.

Public Property Committee: Councilman Holloway, II, Chairman:

Councilman Holloway stated the VFW plaque will be moved to the Veteran's Park. He reported the first annual Juneteenth Celebration event will be held on Saturday, June 19th from 12:00 to 4:00 p.m. It will be held in the parking lot between the Post Office and the Municipal Building. It will be a fun filled event and encouraged everyone to attend.

Mayor Stevenson thanked Councilman Holloway and the Juneteenth Committee for all their work in putting together the celebration.

Public Safety Committee: Councilman DiTonno, Chairman:

Councilman DiTonno stated it was great to see everyone at the Memorial Day Service.

Councilman DiTonno strongly recommended not posting on social media when on vacations, etc.

Councilman Kidd questioned the purchasing of the police vehicles.

Councilman DiTonno stated the Borough is purchasing three (3) SUVs and one (1) Pickup Truck.

Chief Kille stated the purchase is through state contract with Winner Ford. The Borough will not see the purchase until winter or after the first of the year. The purchase is through a bond not a grant. The vehicles are purchased every three (3) years.

Councilman Kidd questioned which other police departments in Gloucester County uses pickup trucks.

Councilman DiTonno stated Woolwich uses it in their patrols.

Councilman Kidd stated he will be in touch with Chief Kille.

Community Betterment Committee: Councilman Kidd:

Councilman Kidd discussed the Recreation Committee and he asked anyone for names to fill the Committee.

Mayor Stevenson gave his sincere condolences to Councilman Kidd on the loss of his brother.

Councilman DiTonno stated his wife would like to join the Committee.

Construction and Licensing Committee: Council President Giovannitti, Chairman:

Council President Giovannitti requested a letter of thanks be sent to the Paulsboro High School Band for their participation in the Memorial Day Service.

Council President Giovannitti stated his committee is in the process of hiring another person in the Code Office. Administrator Jacobucci will advertise the position and hopefully can appoint in August. Mr. Marra is doing a good job and he thanked him for his service. He also thanked Chief Kille and the Police Department on their work on a series of events and for their dedication.

Councilman Haynes stated there is a new baseball team at the Paulsboro High School and they are playing tomorrow at 4:00 p.m.

Councilman Kidd questioned when it was discussed to hire someone in the Code Office.

Mayor Stevenson stated it was brought on the floor early in the year.

Mayor Stevenson thanked the Police Department with their work on the shootings.

Mayor Stevenson thanked Councilman Holloway on the Juneteenth Celebration and the plaque from the VFW to be placed at the Veteran's Park. He thanked all those who attended the Memorial Day Services as well as the workers. He thanked Weiss Department Store for the donation of the flags. The Wreaths were anonymously donated. He also thanked the Paulsboro High School Band.

Chief Kille placed a statement on social media that the police Department strives to serve the community the best they can. Investigations are very active. If anyone has any concerns to contact the Police Department or the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office.

Mayor Stevenson discussed the creation of the Paulsboro Historic Preservation Commission that will consist of Dr. Walter Quint as the Chair. Jennifer Maden,

Eric Singleton, Councilman Holloway, Marc Kamp and James Pratz will also serve on the Commission. He thanked them for their service on the Paulsboro Historic Preservation Commission which will continue to expand efforts to celebrate the contributions of Fort Billingsport to the United States of America and to preserve the Paul House and convert it into the home of the Paulsboro Historic Society and the long-term goal is to create a Historic Preservation District. He will serve as its liaison.

Council President Giovannitti moved and Councilman Giampola seconded to create and accept the Paulsboro Historical Committee. All were in favor of the motion.

Dr. Quint stated the process is to form the Commission and then place an historic preservation element in the Master Plan. There are six (6) sites that are eligible for inclusion on both the state and national Registers of Historic places and would be considered a tourist destination.

Councilman Kidd stated he has received another letter from the Post Office regarding dogs. He will contact the Post Office tomorrow.

Councilman Giampola discussed "ring doorbells" and asked Chief Kille to explain this to the residents.

Chief Kille stated anybody can enter information but all Police channels are encrypted. Channels not encrypted are the EMS channels. He ensures anyone calling the Police Department to make a report or complaint that no one is hearing it as it is encrypted.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Mayor Stevenson opened the floor to the public and asked anyone speaking to give their name, address and reminded everyone there was a five (5) minute time limit.

Councilman Giampola moved and Councilman DiTonno seconded to open the floor to the public at 7:20 p.m. All were in favor of the motion.

Marc Kamp, Greater Paulsboro Chamber of Commerce, stated they will be going ahead with the Independence Day Parade on July 3rd.

Chief Kille asked Mr. Kamp to contact the Police Department to coordinate traffic control.

Mayor Stevenson questioned if the Lighthouse was going to be opened.

Mr. Kamp stated the Lighthouse will be opened to recognize National Lighthouse Day on August 7th and the Lighthouse will be open on August 6th for its Grand Opening.

Jennifer Turner, 233 West Buck Street, apologized to Mayor and Council regarding the tree at the water tower as it is thriving. She stated she also received a letter from the Post Office and she would like to see a "Deaf Child" sign placed on her street.

Councilman Haynes stated he will speak with Mr. Schoch in the Public Works Department regarding the sign.

Ms. Turner wished all good luck in the Primary Election.


There was not any further public participation.
